Epistle of Rebuke ex- pected soon



...continued from front page rally held in Nashville's Centennial Park for the Annual Celebration of the Preservation for Obscure Minorities in early May of this year, "if this debauchery of our name continues we will lead organized protests and pickets to right this injustice."

Considering the threat of a possible standoff during next fall's annual homecoming festivities, administration is quickly working to come up with a solution to resolve the conflict.

"Our intent is not to offend anyone," said Dr. C. E. Hardy, Trevecca's Dean of Institutional Control and Development, "The native Trojans of the area are a good people, and I'm sure we can come to a solution in a timely

manner that will be agreeable for everyone involved."

"We won't let them ruin our homecoming festivities," said an adamant John T. Benson, Trevecca's Assistant Dean of Compassionate Ministries and Peacemaking, "if those fools picket, we will use force to protect our Trojan pride."

Despite Dean Benson's remarks, other leading authorities at Trevecca have decided a change in mascots is the best way to avoid conflict and a possible expensive and time consuming lawsuit.

Preliminary plans to unveil a new mascot are rumored to be underway and an official statement is expected to be released sometime before the beginning of the fall semester.

Another possibility that has leaked from recent

Trevecca Board of Trustee meetings is the "Trevecca Pilgrims". According to reliable sources, if the mascot is changed to the "Trevecca Pilgrims", the athletic department will support the idea by changing the name of the Trevecca gymnasium from Mark R. Moore Gymnasium to "The Mecca of Trevecca".

"We're on a journey," said Dr. S.S. White, Trevecca's Dean of Allegorical Nonsense, "our name may be gone, but we wish to be rather than to seem. Even though we're on the potter's wheel, we desire to extend the grace and peace to our fellow native Trojans and continue in the tradition of excellence that we call the Trevecca Community. Amen."

TNU Prof. suffers third heart attack

Condition now stable as chapel worship leader almost goes to that final choir loft in the sky

The Trevecca Student Body had itself a scare last Wednesday when Professor Sam Green, Trevecca's chapel worship leader, fell to the ground grasping his chest. The professor's brother, Tim Green, quickly rushed to the stage with a bottle of anointing oil while several cell-phone savvy students dialed 911. Luckily the ambulance arrived quickly, where it rushed Green to the hospital, where he is now in stable condition after careful monitoring.

While to the freshman and sophomore classes this came as a surprise, upperclassmen might remember two years ago when this same occurrence happened during chapel, during the song "Every Move I Make," in which Leader Green began to sing too loudly and dramatically, resulting in a startling blow to his heart.

"While I always noticed that his face turned really red," said sophomore Meghan Harmon, "I never thought that something as serious as a heart attack could happen."

Said Green from the hospital bed, "I realize that my heart has suffered physically from all the stress I put into

my performance, but emotionally and spiritually, my heart couldn't be better."

This is the third heart attack for Green, his first happening at the age of twenty-eight, while he was leading a small church in Kentucky as worship minister. He was forced to resign, being that his heart attack almost killed him.

Doctor Meth O. Dist of Baptist Hospital commented on Green's condition, stating, "while I see that Green is

very dedicated to his singing and leading of worship, he must begin thinking of his health. Another heart attack, even a minor one, could be fatal. Therefore, we have limited Sam to only hymns up until the end of school, so as to prevent any sudden, unnecessary strains on his heart.

We hope that this will allow his heart enough time to recover, so that he might be able to work his way back up to full capacity."

Sam Green, though a bit bummed that his favorite song "Shout to the Lord" will have a few weeks off of the rotation, is nonetheless optimistic about his recovery.

"The Trevecca students need me," stated Green, "to lead them full force into the battlefield of worship. And even if it requires me to hold my breathe for five minutes while I sing 'And Can It Be?,' that's a risk I'm willing to take."


